COURT OF APPEAL BETA PILOT - NOTICE OF APPEAL - FORM 7

Commencing August 1, 2018, there is a new way of completing and submitting the Court of Appeal Notice of Appeal (Form 7) which is being piloted. The specially designed application will allow users to generate and submit the Notice of Appeal form (Form 7) online as well as resume previously saved Notice of Appeal forms.

Important Note: In this current phase of the pilot there are some matters which **cannot be** completed through this new application and they include:

- Supreme Court Family matters
- Supreme Court files which have a sealing order or ban on publication
- Appeals under the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act and Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act

Should you wish to submit a Notice of Appeal form for these types of matters, you would need to use the regular efiling process or file in person.

Why are we doing this?

- To improve your experience
- Automated acceptance of the efiled Notice of Appeal (Form 7)
- Facilitate easier completion of forms by using data from lower court case
- Reduce errors
- Enables automating registry process

What do you need to do?

- Use the new application: next time you start a Notice of Appeal for the Court of Appeal, we would ask you to try the new application.
